




Bill Beachler 1945 - 2016



HUES has dedicated this event to the memory of Bill Beachler, one of the founding members of LAHR and an inspirational activist for the LGBT community in the Lansing area. Bill served as a board member, secretary, and publisher of the LGBT News, LAHR's monthly newsletter.

In 2000, Bill generously contributed to Michigan State University to create the Pride scholarship, an annual scholarship that provides financial assistance to students who demonstrate a commitment to LGBT leadership. He also served as secretary on the board of the MSU GLBT Alumni Association. During his life, Bill also supported various state and national LGBT organizations, such as the Human Rights Campaign, the Michigan Organization for Human Rights, the Triangle Foundation, and Equality Michigan.

Bill Beachler was an inspiration for HUES, and events like The Come Out would not have been possible without him. We thank him for all the hard work and activism that he has provided to the Lansing LGBT community.
